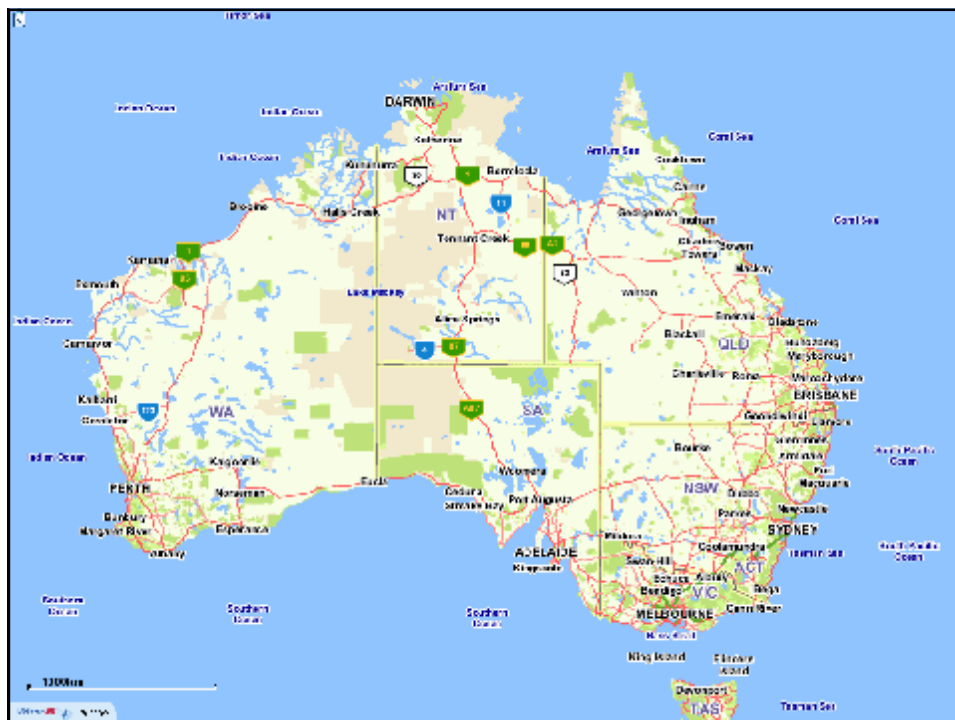
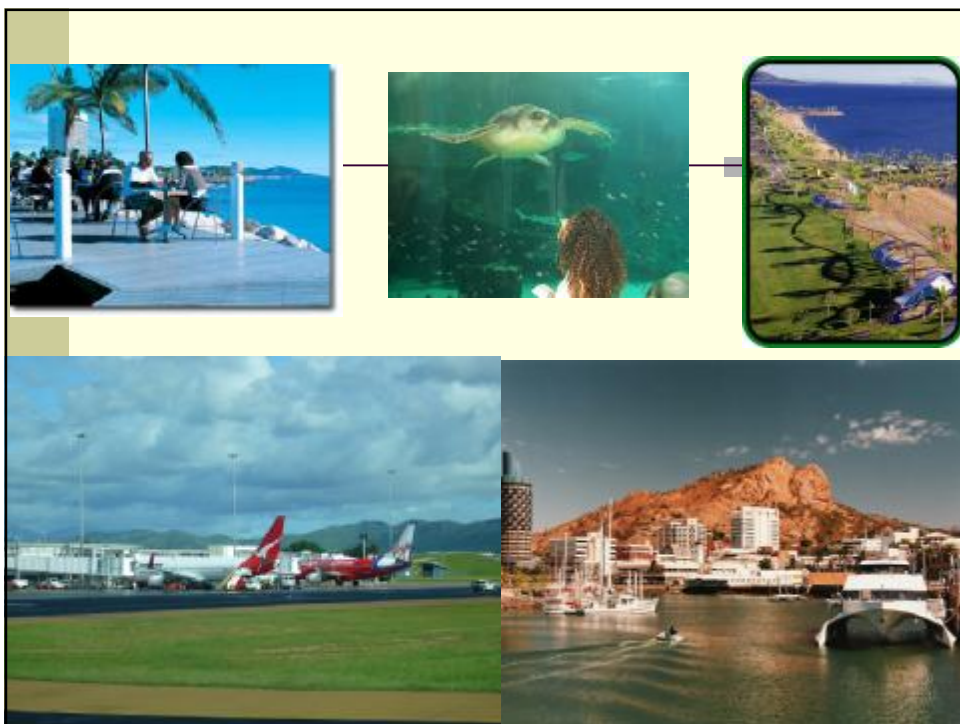
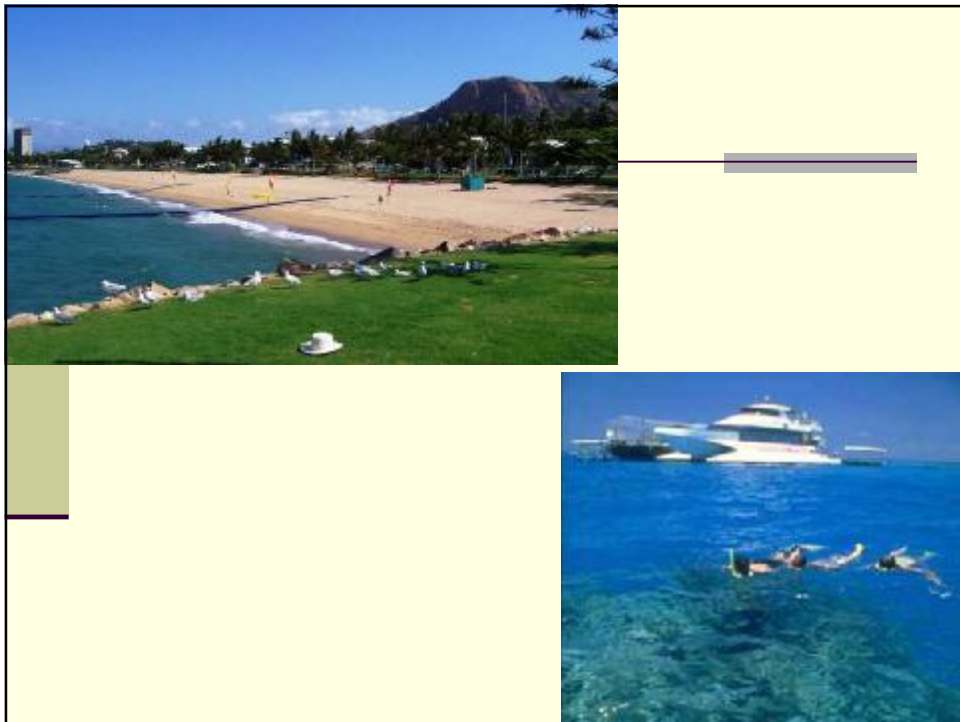

Australia

- n Population: 23.6 Million (2014)
- n Occupational Therapists: 16,009 (WFOT, 2014)
- n WFOT Approved OT education programs (in 23 Universities): 36 (WFOT, 2014)
- n Female OTs: 90%
- n National Registration commencing in July 2012
- n OT Australia – National OT Association with branches in each state / Territory

Education

- n Bachelor Degree
- n Master Degree (Profession Entry)
- n Master Degree by coursework / Research
- n PhD / Doctoral Degree

Practice Settings

- n Commonwealth, State, Local council, private practice,
 - n public and private hospitals
 - n medical rehabilitation units
 - n community health centres
 - n home care services
 - n aged care facilities
 - n psychiatric clinics, hostels and hospitals
 - n vocational rehabilitation centres
 - n schools and education facilities
 - n independent living and respite centres, and
 - n private practice, etc.

Scope of Practice

n **Working with children:**

- n Helping children achieve their developmental milestones such as fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination.
- n Educating and involving parents, carers and others to facilitate the normal development and learning of children.

Scope of Practice

n **Rehabilitation and aged care:**

- n Helping clients regain or enhance their daily lives after specific events such as hip replacement or stroke.
- n Assessing and modifying clients' home and community environments to improve their safety and independence.
- n Prescribing and educating clients and carers in the use of adaptive equipment to assist function.

Scope of Practice

n **Acute care:**

- n Specialist interventions in various health conditions including surgery, burns, HIV and acute mental health.
- n Assessing clients' cognition, function and psychosocial needs.
- n Monitoring clients' function and progress, prescribing adaptive equipment to ensure safety upon discharge from hospitals.

Scope of Practice

n **Injury management:**

- n Using specialised assessments to determine the functional requirements of various jobs, and clients' capacity to return to work.
- n Designing and coordinating graded return to work programs.
- n Educating clients in safe work practices.
- n Modifying the work environment to suit the needs of individuals so as to prevent or minimise injuries.

Scope of Practice

n **Mental health:**

- n Designing individual and group programs and activities to enhance clients' independence in everyday activities.
- n Developing coping strategies for clients in overcoming their mental health issues.
- n Improving clients' confidence and self esteem in social situations.

Medicare

- n Mental health & well-being
- n Individual care plan: up to 10 sessions per year
- n Services provided by psychologists, social workers, and allied health professions including OTs.

NDIS

n National Disability Insurance Scheme

- n provide support for people with disabilities, their families and carers based on individual needs, goals and aspirations.
- n The scheme gives people with a permanent or significant disability more choice and control over how their support is delivered by providing individualised funding.
- n The program will deliver a lifelong approach to disability support services by carefully considering support needs and goals, and developing a personalised plan.
- n May shape or influence OT service developments
- n Commenced July 2013 with regional implementation

OT Trends in Australia

- n Incorporate modern technologies and communication advancements in therapy. 治疗及评估工具科技日新月异，例如利用信息技术、计算机辅助康复、体感游戏、虚拟现实、互联网络的运用等 (e.g. Video-conference, Tele-Rehabilitation / Tele- Health, use of App programs for assessment and intervention)
- n 基于循证医学 (**evidence-based practice**)
- n 初级卫生保健 (**primary health care**)
- n 社区康复 (**community based rehabilitation**)
 - n 如家居训练、环境改造、防跌、生活习惯重组及自我管理)
- n Occupation Focus & Occupation Based Intervention
 - n 走出医疗系统，进入羣众生活及社区福利发展 (addressing occupational deprivation, occupational balance, occupational reconciliation and occupational justice in the community)
